



## Opening of Two Literacy Classes for Women

During the May 2009 visit to Afghanistan, Afghan Education for a Better Tomorrow (AEBT) and Support & Assistance for Poor Women & Working Children Organization (SAPWOCO) to provide funding solely to help the Afghan women with illiteracy.



AEBT and SAPWOCO were able to successfully create and approve two contracts for literacy teachers. The teachers for the program include Ms. Shakilla Royeen and Ms. Marzia Noor. Both teachers will be teaching literacy to Afghan women and street children which make up a total of 60 students.

The program has been established under the guidance and supervision of AEBT. As such, AEBT will provide for the teacher's salary. SAPWOCO will provide the teacher and the training facility. The first of a series of women's literacy classes are designed to fast-track women who desperately need literacy and vocational training to support their families.

The contracts have been signed between both nonprofit organizations to take effect from 6/1/09 to 5/31/2010.

The rate for the teachers is \$100.00 per month for 12 months per teacher.

The location of the program is in Darulaman, close to Habibia High School.
